### Laurent Baheux

Born in 1970, in Poitiers, he made his debut as an autodidact in the early 1990s, during the time of film, as a photographer in the regional sports press. To find a place in the profession, he moved to Paris, where he worked for major photo agencies and media specializing in international sports news. In 2002 he turned to Africa and the wildlife of large land mammals. In 2007, after 5 years of shooting in the savannah, he began to show his snapshots of wildlife captured on the spot, instinctively. In 2009, he published his first work based on his African work: «Terre des Lions» then in 2011 «D'ivoire & d'ébène». In 2013, he became a goodwill ambassador for the United Nations Environment Program and participated in the Wild & Precious anti-poaching campaign. Praised for their aesthetic strength and authenticity, Laurent's photos are the subject of books, publications, exhibitions, conferences and are shown in galleries in France and abroad.



### Matteo Bosi

Matteo Bosi was born in 1966 in Cesena. He loves experimenting, using multiple expressive tools, and for this reason his long artistic career is characterized by continuous research. It was at the end of the 1980s that he began to work with analog photographs, arriving in a few years also using digital techniques. The first series of photographs manipulated in post production or hand painted in the *Ultra Homines* series are from the mid-1990s. He has exhibited his art in numerous group and solo exhibitions in galleries throughout Europe. Some special mentions are worthy of note such as the celeste award and the two editions of *Tau Visual Italia*. In 2013 he went to Moscow for a solo exhibition and the following year to Barcelona, before arriving in 2016 at the important international *Nord Art* event in Germany. His photographs, already included in the *DOC Center for Documentation of Modern and Contemporary Arts* in Romagna (Imola) project, are also present in the important setting of the *Esercizi dello sguardo*, Centro Culturale Mercato di Argenta (Fe) 2018. Since 2000 he has also worked as a freelancer as a *communication designer*. He collaborated for some years in the realization of the art serigraphs of Dario Fo and edited the graphics of the 2010 edition of the *San Marino International Film Festival* and that of the 2015 *Montefeltro Film School Festival*. In 2016 he created the photographic exhibition *Ciao Marcello dedicated* to Marcello Mastroianni and in 1919 the one on *Fellini ritrovato*. 8 ½ in the unpublished photographs by *Paul Ronald*, this photographic exhibition also tells the backstage of Italian cinema, bringing to light the photographic archive of the *Centro Cinema* in Cesena. In 2021 he made a docufilm dedicated to the Alessandro Bonci Theater in Cesena. In 2022 he participated in the exhibition *Other Identity Other forms of cultural and public identity*, Genova Guidi & Schoen-Arte Contemporanea and began a collaboration with the Secret Art Ltd Gallery in London.

## Tommaso "iomso" Cavallini

The works of IOMSO want to indicate an Italian artisan and artistic reality between portraiture, pop and street art, also connected with the world of tattoos, using icons, graphics, popular characters together with unpublished drawings. In his works he uses oil tempera technique, collages, Plexiglas, wood, metals, with a continuous search for details. Through his works the face and body of the characters manage to exert the power of fascination, they themselves become objects of design. It is therefore a question of images that are subtracted from death and remain eternally alive. Responsible for the study and development of projects between corporate visual graphics and publishing, set-ups in collaboration with the architectural studio for events and fairs, web graphic design. Since 2003 he has a painting workshop in Milan and Cusago where he develops artistic pieces, serigraphs, engraves.




## Alessandro Corina

Alessandro Corina, born in 1988, is a product designer and interior designer based in Grosseto. His is an emotional and aesthetic design, Alessandro wants to amaze and empathize with the interlocutor. His objects transmit a strong sensory impact, they excite. In 2018, his Home Studio was selected among the best projects within the Best Italian Interior Design Selection of Platform and exhibited both at the Milan Triennale and in the United States during the Archweek event in Miami. In 2019, the Evergreen sofa, designed for the Gobbo Salotti company, was chosen for the layout of the eighth edition of MasterChef Italia. In his projects, the strong bond with nature shines through, ancestral, powerful images recur, which aim to rediscover true humanity. For Alessandro, design is also a social tool, so much so that in February 2020 he was selected among the 2,000 entrepreneurs and economists under 35 and participated in Economy of Francesco, an event wanted by the Pope to plan a more just, fraternal and sustainable economy.



Born in Italy, Rosso has lived and worked in London since 2004. She holds a Masters in International Communication and Human Rights from City University of London (UK) and worked in marketing and advertising before changing career direction to the arts. visual. His work has been featured in Colossal, Evolved Mag, MyModernMet, Artists & Illustrator; The Artist's Magazine, etc. and on the cover of Arena Magazine (Australia) and is currently held in private collections around the world. It is currently represented by Sugarlift (New York, USA) and ZebraOne (London, UK). Finalist at the "Beautiful Bizarre Art Prize" 2021; winning the "Jackson Open Painting Prize 2019 (JOPP2019)" for the Portrait / Figure category; the "The Harbor Gallery Award" and the "The Artist's Exhibition Award" (TALP Open 2019); "The Holly Bush Emerging Woman Painter Prize 2017" and "Emerald Winter Pride Art Award" in 2016. In his portraiture, the London-based artist Rosso Emerald Crimson renders female subjects that emerge through a haze of pastels and muted tones. Issues of racial justice, gender inequality and the environmental crisis have all played an important role in his recent work. He instills answers to current affairs and questions about the future, which often act as a catalyst for his projects.



# Enrico De Luigi

Portrait and still photographer Enrico De Luigi, aka Chico, was born in Rimini in 1966. He began his career in Milan in the late 1980s and has collaborated with the most prestigious national and international magazines such as GQ, Vanity Fair , Rolling Stone, Riders, Sportweek. He has won awards (such as the one for best stage photography attributed to a shot on the set of Chaos calmo, an intense black and white with Nanni Moretti and Valeria Golino), photographed in Polaroid 50 × 60 actors and directors at the Venice and Berlin Festivals , has been collaborating for years with Fandango (he has just finished L'ultimo terrestre, the film debut of the cartoonist Gipi which will be presented at the next Venice Film Festival). He worked as super 8 operator on Emir Kusturica's "Super 8 stories", the documentary featuring the exploits of the director's rock band. The interest and curiosity for human expression led Enrico to constantly explore other worlds with an anthropological eye: a naturalistic expression of great impact that reveals a deeper meaning and a natural revelation of the subject itself.



### Ivana Dostalova

Czech freelance photographer and visual artist based in Prague, founder and CEO of Voitopi Photography (fine-art photography, commercial projects and documentaries). In art photography, she devotes herself to multiple exposures and visual art, these photographs create several large series of fairy tale poems that reflect the problems of today's times such as anonymity, social media etc. (Ghosts series, We Are All Dreamers, Lost in the City, Memories, etc.), relationships and characters (Relationships, Metamorphosis series, Portraits of characters). In September 2018, the Lost in the City and We Are All Dreamers collections were selected for the Other Art Fair at Mana Contemporary in Chicago. Ivana is also dedicated to children's author books, in 2018 she published her second children's author book, in which photographic multiple exposures were used for the first time in the genre of children's literature (What is Princess Elly Sky Dreaming About). Ivana is also the author of more than 130 paintings, which are together with photographs represented in private collections in the Czech Republic, Berlin, Chicago, Atlanta, New York. In 2018 Ivana received an honorable mention at the Bordeaux Art Limited Abstract Competition. In 2019, her photography from the Metamorphosis series (Finally Free) was selected for the Fine Art Gallery on Lens Culture web. In 2019, Ivana won 2nd place at the Czech Press Photo Competition in the Portrait category and in 2020 her work was selected for the Los Angeles Other Art Fair. Her work has been repeatedly selected for the Frontispiece and the Excellence collection by Art Limited France.

### Michela Gioachin

Michela Gioachin lives and works in Vicenza. In 2003 he graduated with honors from the Academy of Fine Arts in Venice, studying painting with the masters Riccardo Guarneri, Ennio Finzi, Luca Bendini and Maurizio Martelli and anatomy with prof. Mauro Zocchetta with whom he subsequently collaborated. During his academic studies, he was struck by the shock that gave rise to his current pictorial research: "Everything was born from a mistake. During my studies at the Academy I photographed the other students, I portrayed them looking for the most disparate expressions in their faces. I was looking for detail and precision for a subsequent painting that was close to hyperrealism. And then it happened that a shot was wrong ... ". This particular "error", called glitch (term used to indicate a brief defect of the system in various fields of application of electronics), stops being waste and becomes a romantic mistake, a form of poetry through which the subjects are "electrically divided", "split" to tell about the constant becoming.

### Marco Grassi

Marco Grassi (Grama) is a painter of Italian origin, born in 1966 in Milan and now living & working in Lugano, Switzerland. In his works, the ethereal and elusive, delicate and perfect beauty of young women predominates on all other subjects. Since the beginnings of his career, Marco Grassi developed a very personal style which praises the identity of the female subject in the specific moment in which they are painted. With his intense female portraits, Marco searches to captivate the viewer, by creating a silent dialogue between the subject and the audience. Marco Grassi's pieces are striking, they combine pure decoration and hyper-realistic colour. In his most recent works, Marco has abandoned the element that was once his trademark style and technique: the decisive brushstrokes which outlined his anatomic forms and contrasted with bold colours, blended with a spatula, and drippings to break them down and make them more subtle. His recent subjects display less certainty. Today, the background against which they are represented is more decisive and reflects the subjects' facial expressions and intense silence, creating a complicity with the observer. Marco Grassi's works have been exhibited in many solo and group exhibitions, and international fairs such as Art Basel, SCOPE Basel and the Moscow Art Fair. He was selected to be at the opening of the Italian Pavilion at the Venice Biennale in 2011.

### Giulio Iurissevich

Giulio lurissevich began his career as a photographer and graphic designer in 1998. Specialized in fashion, lifestyle and beauty, he is also an urban artist. Giulio focuses on the human figure and above all on the slight nuances of expression in portraits of female faces. Driven by instinct and inspired by the human form, Giulio's work explores volume, geometry and color, reducing unnecessary effects and focusing instead on clean lines and shapes. His work is abstract, with a strong influence on urban street culture. # Riccardo Raul Papavero

Riccardo Raul Papavero inherits from his mother, an established artist, an interest in art in all its forms. Travel to Europe, Africa and South America with the voracious curiosity of those who want to discover and learn about the art of diversity. The need to deal with new artistic expressions leads him to the creation of multi-material collages: the beginning of the adventure takes place halfway between play and chance... ### **SNYDER**

The artist behind the pseudonym "SNYDER" occupies a unique position in the art world. His many years of work as an architect and his passion for style writing are the main driving forces behind the conceptualization of a new aesthetic. He translates these into motifs that stand out for their oscillation between majestic harmony and iridescent power. His motifs often show the fragile beauty of endangered animal species, which lend his art an auratic moment. SNYDER unfolds the animal as a soulful counterpart layer by layer on different media such as paper, canvas or wall surfaces with the spray can. The blurs created at the color fringes of the different layers give the missing depth of our digital image space a moment of authentic wildness. At the same time, in each of his works SNYDER imitates color aberrations, so-called chromatic aberrations, which have found their way into our visual canon via analog and digital imaging processes. SNYDER's works encourage us to relearn instinctive perceptual behavior. In order to be seen, SNYDER's animal worlds adapt their appearance to the urban jungle and attentively target every passing viewer. They develop a pulling effect that is difficult to escape as a passer-by.
